April 8, 2018 — **Annual Lake Club Meeting** will be held at the Wells Township Hall, 18200 Roberds Lake Blvd starting at 1 PM. We will email/mail a reminder identifying a guest speaker. This is an opportunity to learn more about your Club's activities.

April 21, 2018 – Roadside Cleanup is our chance to contribute to the National effort to help clean up our neighborhoods. The date coincides with the National Earth Day date. Come to the Wells Township Hall parking lot at 9 AM, pick the area you want to walk and we will give you a vest along with some garbage bags and you are all set. There will be some treats for you before you start.

Curly leaf pondweed

Last spring, the Club worked with Lake Management, Inc. to control the growth of curly leaf pondweed. There were 2 parts to this effort. The first was to control the invasive weeds in the public access area. This area is treated as it is one where most lake residents with boats/pontoons use it to launch and load their

watercraft in the spring and fall. It has been a heavily infested area in the past. The first part of the treatment went reasonably well. Funds were raised through the generosity of the lake residents making additional contributions with their membership forms. Thank you for your support. In addition, the Tri Lakes Sportsman Club made a generous \$500 donation. The Club also applied for and received a DNR grant. We have been informed by the DNR that this grant program will not be available in 2018 or 2019.

The second part of the weed control effort was along the shorelines for the home owners. For this part, the homeowners paid the treatment cost. The results here varied greatly depending on what part of the Lake your property is on. Some property owners had so few weeds, treatment was not necessary while others had very heavy infestation. One challenge was that the pondweed reached the chemical treatment growth stage at different times in different parts of the Lake. This resulted in Lake Management, Inc. coming out on multiple dates to complete the treatment. It also meant that a different permit was needed for the later maturing weeds as the original permit allowing treatment of the entire property owner's lakeshore expired on May 10th. A second permit was applied for and received to complete the treatment.

Mike O'Connell from Lake Management will be at the Annual Meeting to further explain the 2017 effort and discuss plans for 2018. DNR permits need to be applied for before the Annual Meeting. Roberds Lake Club



The Roberds Lake Club organizes events throughout the summer. The events start with the Annual Meeting in April, then the roadside cleanup, a 4th of July Boat Parade, a Nite to Unite event followed by an Annual Picnic. Our Club has been involved with treating curly leaf pondweeds each spring for the last several years. This requires getting DNR permits, finding and working with a chemical applicator, applying for grants and working with the DNR to find the best site to treat. If you have questions about treating your shoreline for curly leaf pondweed, send an email to roberdslakeclub@gmail.com.

New in the last year has been the Nextdoor electronic network. Nextdoor is the private social network for you, your neighbors and your community. It's the easiest way for you and your neighbors to talk online. It allows neighbors to communicate electronically about such activities as lost and found, items for sale, neighborhood events, etc. If you are interested in joining, click on the button on the bottom of the home page at RoberdsLakeClub.com website.

Every two years, a directory is published. This directory includes two listings of all properties around the Lake. The first list is by address and the second is by owner. In addition, there are pages showing Lake freeze and ice out dates, an area map, sewer system do's and don'ts and repair phone number as well as other items of interest. This directory is complimentary when you are a Club member.

Our Club's structure consists of a Mayor, Secretary/Treasurer and 5 councilmen. All are elected at the Club's annual meeting each spring. We encourage you to join. Annual membership costs \$25 for a calendar year. There is a membership form on the Club website. In addition, a membership form is included with the annual newsletter mailed each December to all lake residents.
